Collection description:	
<p>Asa Burr (1739/40-1816) of Hingham and Bellingham, Massachusetts, was a private in Col. Williams' Regiment during the French and Indian War. Burr's diary records the march of the Massachusetts militia regiment from Roxbury (leaving May 22) west to Albany and on to Schenectady, where they arrived on June 26. Diary entries continue until September 13, reporting progress of British armies on other fronts, but giving real ^{real} information on the activity of Burr's regiment in the Mohawk Valley. Several marches, including one to German Flatts, are mentioned. The volume also contains miscellaneous accounts pertaining to Burr for the period 1762-1783.</p>
