<p>Collection description:</p> <p style="margin-top: 10px;">This collection of documents is almost entirely comprised of land deeds belonging to the descendants of Thomas Buckingham (d.1657), who settled in Milford, New Haven County, Connecticut in 1639. Also contained within the collection are: several receipts (1694-1784), documents relating to the settlement of estates, two military documents conferring rank, a will and a genealogical chart. The most frequently recurring names are: Samuel Buckingham (1641-1700), Samuel Buckingham (1668-1708), Samuel Buckingham (1693-1749) and Ebenezer Buckingham (1727-1798).</p>
