**COLLECTION DESCRIPTION:**

Concord, Middlesex County, Massachusetts is located fourteen miles northwest of Boston on the Concord River. It was incorporated in 1635.

This small collection of documents pertaining to Concord, Mass., includes a miscellany of items such as a report of the Committee on Publick Affairs; a letter regarding "the present situation of our public affairs" signed by "A Well Wisher to America"; a report of "a committee appointed by said Town of Concord Last may to examine the accounts of Col James Bassett ..."; a coroners inquest for Jacob Bacon; marching orders; an address of John Pope regarding "the Town Meeting to be held at Concord, to consider of, an act upon the Constitution, or Frame of Government"; and a bill from Richardson Tavern for misters Tuttle & Bridge.
