1	c.1770s	Removed from Amelia Trumbull's (-) copy of Susanna Carter's <i>The Frugal Housewife</i> (1772). Recipes for food, wine, and cold remedies.
1a	c.1770s	Belonged to Eunice (Williams) Stone (1745-1836). Recipes for meat, puddings, syllabub, cakes, breads, biscuits, waters, jellies, marmalades, preserves, conserves, candying angelica, and wines and liquor. Instructions for pickling quinces, peaches, walnuts, radish pods, and cucumbers. Also, instructions for washing lace.
2	early 19th c.	Unidentified. Recipes for food, wine, cleaning, dye, medical cures. With index.
3	1829	Belonged to Sarah Agnes Bacon (-) of Boston. Recipes for food, wine, soap, cologne. Also, index and newsclippings of recipes.
4	c.1830	Belonged to M. Rivers (-). Recipes for food.
5	c.1830	Belonged to Susan H. T. Spalding (Mrs. Jason) (-). Recipes for food, dye, ink, wine, "dispepsia".
6	1852-1862	Belonged to Esther G. Coffin Gardner (Mrs. George) (1812-), of Nantucket, Mass. Recipes for food, beer, complexion aids.
7	1850s-1860s	Belonged to Catharine Dean Flint (Mrs. Waldo) (1802-1869), of Boston. Recipes for food, washing clothes. Includes loose recipes and details of dinner parties.
8	c.1860	Belong to M. E. Harris (-). Recipes for food, wine. With index.
9	c.1860	Belonged to Augusta M. Boyds Tilghman (-) of Baltimore, Md. Recipes for food. With newsclippings of recipes.
10	c.1860-1878	Belonged to Helen A. Lovering (1840-1884) [of Worcester?]. Recipes for food, soap, pomade, and medical cures. Also, account of eggs used by household, sundry accounts of D. Lovering, and a list of the Lovering children's births.
11	c.1860	Unidentified. Recipes for cakes, pies.
