Collection description:

Daniel Dodge (1777-1851) was born in Annapolis, Nova Scotia, and died in Philadelphia, Pa. His family moved to New England during the Revolutionary War. Dodge received a license to preach from the Baptist Church in Baltimore, Md. In 1802, he was pastor of a Church in Wilmington, Del., where he stayed for twenty years. He then served at a church in Piscataway, N.J., until 1832, when he was called to a church in Newark, N.J. In 1839, he became pastor of a church in Philadelphia, where he stayed until his death.

This collection includes letters written to Dodge, touching upon events and people in Baptist churches in Pennsylvania and Delaware. Also included are letters to Letitia Dodge, his second wife, on personal matters. The papers of Jacob Brandt (mostly accounts and receipts) are also included, although no connection between Brandt and Dodge can be determined.
