Collection description:

Ebenezer Dunbar (1777-1877) was born in Leicester, Mass., where he lived all his life. He was part owner (with Emory Bridges and Daniel Draper) of a saw and grist mill in Greenville, Leicester, Mass. He also dealt in real estate. Dunbar was named administrator of land left by Ephraim Copeland ( - ) to the Greenville Cemetery.

This account book is the record of business transactions of the saw and grist mill, and real estate holdings, covering the period 1843 to 1869. The entries refer to services and charges at the mill, and to rents charged and expenditures entailed at Dunbar's other properties. There are also references to expenditures for the Ephraim Copeland land left to the Greenville Cemetery.
