<p>Collection Description:</p> <p>Ebenezer Peck Sperry (1785-1854) was the pastor of the Congregational Church in Dunstable, New Hampshire, from 1813 to 1819. Afterwards, he served in Wenham, Massachusetts, as Chaplain to the House of Correction in Boston, and then settled in Ohio.</p> <p>Sperry's diary is interleaved in <u>The Clergyman's Almanack...</u>, 1817, published by Lincoln & Edmands in Boston. It contains weekly entries which note sermons Sperry and other ministers preached, with textual references and quotations.</p>
