Collection description:

Elbridge Henry Goss (1830-1908) was an active participant in the civic life of Melrose, Mass., and an author of books of local historical interest. He was an auditor, water registrar, trustee of the public library, alderman, treasurer of the Melrose Savings Bank, and member of the Massachusetts legislature. His books include a local history of Melrose, The Melrose Memorial; Early Bells of Massachusetts; and a two volume work on the Life of Colonel Paul Revere.

Most of the collection is correspondence from librarians, local historians, and persons with information for Goss's book on Paul Revere. There is also correspondence of a business nature and some letters relating to his other publications. Principal correspondents include Charles Henry Hart (1847-1918), Martha Joanna Reade Nash Lamb (1826?-1893), and William Frederick Poole (1821-1894). The correspondence is arranged alphabetically by author.
