COLLECTION DESCRIPTION:

The central figures of this collection were members of the Foskett and Fay families. The Foskett family had lived in Charlton, Mass., for generations while the Fay family, although new to Worcester, Mass., were of old New England stock.

Samuel Waters Foskett (1823-1909), the second child and first son of Ebenezer Foskett (1787-1860) and Anna Waters Foskett (1791-1875), grew up in Charlton, Mass. He attended Nichols Academy in Dudley, Mass., in 1843 and 1845, and studied with a J. Pearl in Warren, Mass., in 1844. At times during his life he worked as a farmer, carpenter, teacher, attendant in a mental asylum, and traveling book salesman. He and a partner were unsuccessful in their attempt to become makers of daguerreotype miniature paintings (see receipted bills, 1846-1847).

Georgianna Mason Foskett (1830-1892), the daughter of Ephraim Hubbard and Prudence Hills Mason, left her home in Vermont to work as a hired girl in Massachusetts returning to help her mother and to attend school both as a student and a teacher. In 1853 she became a weaver at the Globe Village mill in Southbridge, Mass., where she stayed until marrying in 1855.

Samuel and Georgianna probably met in West Sutton, Mass., in 1851 where he was teaching school and she was working in the Bullard household. They married on 8 December 1855 in Charlton and had three children: George Mason; Ann (1860-), who married in 1905 Charles R. Stobbs; and Eben. They moved to Webster, Mass., in 1869 and to Worcester, Mass., in 1888.

Eben Foskett (1864-1923) was educated at Webster High School in Webster, Mass., and Nichols Academy. He worked for a time as a printer and for several years was assistant foreman in the

composing room of the Worcester Evening Gazette. In 1895 he graduated with honors from the New York University Medical School. He remained in New York City and worked for two years as an intern at Bellevue Hospital before establishing his practice in that city. He also held the position of assistant professor of gynecology at the University and Bellevue Hospital Medical College.

George Mason Foskett (1856-1916) was the oldest child of Samuel and Georgianna and the brother of Eben. He attended Nichols Academy, Amherst College (grad. 1878, M.A. 1881), and the University of Vermont Medical School, 1880 to 1882. For the period 1878 to 1880, he taught at Webster, Mass. He practiced as a physician in North Dana, Mass., from 1882 to 1889, and at Worcester, Mass., from 1889 to 1912. He married on 4 June 1885, Harriet Ella Lindsey (1851-1900). He married second, on 28 November 1903, Carrie Gilmore. According to a family genealogy, he left Carrie "... out of his will because they did not get along." He had no children with either wife.

Winthrop Baxter Fay (1827-1909) and Elizabeth W. (Fales) Fay (-1910) married in January 1851. They had three children: Norman Herbert; Etta C.; and Flora Gertrude.

Norman Herbert Fay (1852-1919) was a manufacturer of machine tools (Fay & Scott Corp.) in Dexter, Me. He married in 1873 Ada E. West (1853-1934). They had two children: Marion Estelle (1874-1949), who married Peter Plouff (1869-1960); and Winthrop Lincoln (1875-), who married Edith Hale Brewster (1881-1959).

Etta C. Fay Briggs (1858-) married in 1898 Dr. Charles Briggs (-), a widower from California, and with her parents moved to Pasadena.

Flora Gertrude Fay Foskett (1868-1949) graduated from Worcester High School in 1887. Her father's success as a partner in a boot and shoe company allowed her to enjoy a privileged life of leisure and travel.

Eben and Flora probably met in Worcester at the Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church. They married, after a five-year engagement, on 14 October 1897, in Worcester, Mass., and had three children: Winthrop Fay (1899-1915); Elizabeth (1900-); and Eben Maxwell (1904-1985), who married Margaret Johnston. They lived in New York City, though Flora and the children visited family and friends in Webster and Worcester, Mass., or summered at Northport on Long Island during the summer months. After Eben's death in 1923, Flora, along with Elizabeth and "Max", moved to Pasadena, Calif.

This collection, which extends from the eighteenth century documents of the Foskett family to the last entries of Flora's diary written in 1942 in Pasadena, Calif., consists mainly of correspondence. Nearly all of the letters written by Samuel Foskett between 1852 and 1855 are addressed to his future wife. Samuel's letters encourage Georgianna to improve herself—"to exercise in open air" and "to be a Christian"—but more importantly they document the struggles of a young man at mid-nineteenth century to make his way in the world. In a February 1853 letter from Kingston, Ohio, he asks Georgianna to imagine him "with a carpet bag and umbrella traveling from house to house in mud over his shoes." As was true for so many of his contemporaries Samuel considered traveling to California or settling in the west. Friends and relatives wrote with descriptions of life in Kansas and the Minnesota Territory. There are also several account books and a box of receipted bills for the period 1843 to 1903.

Georgianna's letters to Samuel illustrate the more limited opportunities for a young woman in the 1850s to earn her own living. She wrote of their mutual friends, her school life, and interestingly of her life in the mill. Despite the hazards and long hours she writes "I would rather go into the factory than do housework." In March of 1854 she offered Samuel thirteen of the fourteen dollars she had earned in the previous month to make purchases for his farm. She and Samuel both worked and saved for their future together.

There is a small collection of letters, for the period 1849 to 1850, to Samuel from Elizabeth Clifford (-), a young woman who said she met Samuel when he worked at the asylum. Surprisingly she initiated the correspondence that consists of five letters from her and five copies of those of Samuel to her.

Eben Foskett left Worcester for New York University Medical School in November of 1892. In the course of the next five years he wrote over one hundred seventy letters to Flora. He wrote of his classes, his work in the wards of Bellevue Hospital, and of his efforts to set up a practice. On August 26, 1895 he writes that "there are a great many hospital men in the city [NYC] most of them have to hustle to live for a few years." Eben did hustle. He wrote that he found it helpful to make friends with the policeman on his block because "the policeman often has a chance to call a doctor" [20 July 1897]. In the summer months of 1897 Eben found part-time work as one of the fifteen doctors hired by the New York World to care for the poor in the tenements. The collection also includes more than fifty letters written after 1897.

For the period 1891 to 1897 Flora wrote over four hundred fifty letters to Eben. She wrote from her home in Worcester of her many activities and of those of her family and friends. From her extensive travels with her mother, father, and sister across the United States (including the Chicago Columbian Exposition in 1893), Mexico, and Hawaii, she penned keen observations of the various sights and of her fellow travelers. On the occasions when she was separated from Eben after 1897 she wrote over two hundred more; always expressing her love and concern for him.

Flora's voluminous writings show her to be a genteel iconoclast, an introspective extrovert, and an intelligent and articulate observer with a strong desire for self-improvement. She was active in the Epworth League but refused to join the Trinity Methodist church as she did not agree with its tenets. She deplored the condemnation of a woman who became pregnant before marriage--"considering our common humanity how little charity there is for such an error" [23 March 1887]. She was outspoken even when good manners might suggest silence – "I don't know why I have such queer streaks when I must upset someone's mental equilibrium or die in the attempt..." [29 June 1895].

Flora's high spirits and energy are evident in her love of bicycling, rowing, and riding. The epithet "tom boy" seems to fit her. She also took a Chautauqua lecture course, attended concerts, unabashedly read novels, and took up photography. In a later era she might have become a doctor herself. She often and fearlessly dispensed medical advice with Eben's long-distance assistance. While on an Ohio River cruise she rendered her "professional services" to a Mr. G. who suffered from violent chills and a fever. Finally she says "I have doctored all my crowd with quinine" [13 December 1896]. She once gave weight reduction tablets to a friend--"I believe I can eventually combine several drugs to give better results" [June or July 1897]. In June of 1897 she writes "Aunt Belle consulted me in my professional capacity and I gave her my learned advice." Fortunately her only patient to succumb was her dog

"Fluff" who failed to respond to a regimen of brandy, cold baths, and an enema [2 July 1898].

Flora gloried in Eben's affection and in him found the acceptance denied her by her mother. (Both Mrs. Fay and Etta, Flora's older sister, are portrayed as proper, retiring nineteenth century upper class women.) She also delighted in being a friend and mentor to a host of young men and women including Eben's cousin Harry and her cousins "Wint" and Marion Fay.

The collection contains approximately ten letters to Flora from her older sister Etta C. Fay Briggs. Etta's letters report on her parents and her domestic life. Etta also figures prominently in Flora's letters to Eben.

There are a few letters from Norman Herbert Fay in the collection but he, his wife Ada, and their children Marion and Winthrop ("Wint") are often mentioned in Flora's letters.

George Mason Foskett wrote over fifty letters to his family from Amherst College, 1874-1878, and about ten from medical school and from Brattleboro Asylum where he worked. George was a frequent object of Flora's concern, particularly when she visited Worcester. She was fond of him but deplored his taste in women.

There is a small collection of ten or so letters, all but one were addressed to Samuel Waters Foskett, from Marcy Foskett Allen (1785-1861). Marcy was the aunt of Samuel Waters Foskett and the wife of Andrew Allen (1785-1864). She lived in Franklin, N.Y., and was interested in receiving news of home and family. Later she wanted Samuel to take over their farm. An example of her grit: "... I have set down to inform you that I am in Franklin yet a hopen about on one leg but well otherways ... I can't do anything with Uncle Andrew" [27 December 1858].

There are several account books and a box of receipted bills, for the period 1809 to 1863 (including receipts from his estate), for Ebenezer Foskett.

The collection also contains receipted bills, legal documents, photographs, account books, diaries and ephemera.
