STATEMENT BY THE TREASURER

The book value of the invested funds of the Society on August 31, 1970 was \$2,487,725 and these investments had a market value of \$3,314,045 of which 61% was represented by common stocks. This market value was \$419,000 (11.2%) lower than a year ago.

Income from investments was \$158,955, an increase of \$7,240 over the year before, representing a return of 4.8% on the market value of the securities (6.4% on the cost.)

During the year, \$186,944 was received from bequests and donations to the principal funds of the Society.

Approximately \$20,000 more income was received from the Paine Charitable Trust as a result of the death last year of the principal lifetime beneficiary.

Since May, 1969, the Society has employed FMR Investment Management Service, Inc. as investment adviser. The Finance Committee meets quarterly with the individuals who handle our account and is satisfied with the results of this arrangement to date.
