Report of the Treasurer

The Treasurer presents herewith his report of receipts and disbursements for the eleven-month period ending August 31, 1962, including a statement of the Society's investments and a schedule of Fund Accounts.

With the increasing difficulty of obtaining final figures for the usual fiscal year ending September 30 in time for the Annual Meeting two weeks later, it seemed sensible to change the Society's fiscal year to the twelve months ending August 31. This was done with the result that the present report covers eleven months instead of twelve.

The present balance of the Purchasing Fund is \$5,393.43. The Bibliography Fund has been increased by the sale of Evans and Spear publications and by the generous contributions of two members of the Society in the amount of \$6,778.74 and the present balance is \$18,629.50.

STATEMENT BY THE TREASURER

The total book value of the invested assets of the Society is \$1,183,-990.37. These securities had a market value on August 31, 1962 of \$2,624,925.50, 77% of which was represented by common stocks and the balance by bonds and preferred stocks. Thus, these assets are now worth \$1,440,935 more than they were when received from donors or originally purchased for the Society (and approximately \$192,000 (6.8%) less than eleven months ago).

The income received from investments during the eleven-month period totaled \$87,166.25 representing, on an annual basis, a return of 3.5% on the market value of these securities as of August 31, 1962 (7.8% of book value).

It should be pointed out that the "Excess of Expenditures over Income" of \$12,054.13 appearing in Exhibit "B" above does not represent an operating deficit but rather reflects the expenditures made for the new lighting in the library from funds generously given to the Society during the 1960 fiscal year and designated at that time for this purpose.
