OCTOBER 18, 1989 GODDARD-DANIELS HOUSE, WORCESTER

BRUCE GODDARD DANIELS has served as Treasurer during a period in which the annual operating budget of the Society has risen from less than two hundred thousand dollars to more than two million and the value of its endowment has grown from below three and one-half million dollars to more than eighteen million; and whereas

BRUCE GODDARD DANIELS, through the instrument of his family foundation, has been a principal benefactor of the Society; and whereas the benefactions known as the Fred Harris Daniels Fund and the Goddard-Daniels House will serve always as reminders of his and his family's affectionate commitment to AAS and the scholars it serves; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Members, Officers, and Councillors of the American Antiquarian Society applaud BRUCE GODDARD DANIELS on the completion of his seventeen years of service as their Treasurer, register their profound gratitude for his friendship and faithful and prudent stewardship, pray that his youthful countenance will always grace the scholars' lounge, and wish for him in the future Brasher doubloons and Millbury stamps aplenty for him to discover and savor; and upon the records of the Society let this Resolution be inscribed and to BRUCE GODDARD DANIELS let these sentiments be made known.
