Proceedings of the Semi-annual Meeting

APRIL 20, 1955

AT THE COLONIAL SOCIETY, BOSTON

THE semi-annual meeting of the American Antiquarian I Society was held at the Colonial Society, 87 Mount Vernon Street, Boston, Massachusetts, on April 20, 1955, at 11 o'clock. Papers were read by John Alden on "A Season in Federal Street: J. B. Williamson and the Boston Theatre, 1796–97," and by William A. Jackson who presented Lyle H. Wright's "A Few Observations on American Fiction, 1851–75," since Mr. Wright, due to illness, was unable to be present.
